4. **Approval of February Meeting Minutes:** Motion made and supported to approve the February minutes. Passed.
5. **Treasurer's Report:** Gary Zondervan reported the checking account balance is \$10,938.26 and the money market balance is \$31,605.21 for a total of \$42,543.47 cash available.
6. **Booster Book/Athletic Directory Update:** Larry reported we have about \$9,000 outstanding. Larry will make calls and contact those of us who are willing to make calls to outstanding advertisers.
7. **Golf Tourney Update:** Brochures for mailing out were stuffed this evening before the meeting. Everything is set we just need to concentrate on getting more golfers, tee sponsors, and prizes. We will be giving away an embroidered event shirt, golf towel, and 2 sleeves of golf balls to each golfer.
8. **Booster Bin:** Reminder, the Labor Day Pancake Breakfast will be the kick off of our new line of Booster apparel. Thanks to the committee for their work on designing the new logos and determining what has been the best sellers in the past. A special thank you to Aurora Jubile for her great work on the Green and Gold day shirts. Boosters has never been involved in this before. We can now use this as a fundraiser going forward.
9. **New Business:**
 - a. Weight room and speed/strength training equipment. This proposal will add to the equipment that is on hand and replace some items that need replacing. The cost is \$951.60 plus shipping. Motion made and supported to purchase the equipment with the exception of the squat machine, which is tabled until a future date. Passed.
 - b. Motion made and supported to purchase a "ground battle shoot" and a "classic two man sled" for the football program. Total cost is \$3700.00 plus shipping. Passed.
10. **Athletic Director's Reports:**

- a. Middle School Athletic Director David Belden reported both the baseball and softball teams are young this year but he is hearing good things from the coaches. Track and Field had 3 meets in May.
- b. High School Athletic Director David Parkes reported the Golf team is young again, they broke 200 twice this year and are undefeated so far. Linfield Christian will be a challenge. Coach Knutson is doing a great job, he ran our first Invitational and it was very successful. OC won the tournament.

11. Coaches' Reports:

- a. Girls Soccer: Dave Belden reported the varsity lost in the 2nd round of CIF Playoffs. They tied the school record for fewest goals allowed. This is their 4th year as league champions.
- b. Baseball: The varsity is 1 and 1 in league. The new scoreboard is up. Shop students are making the bat racks and benches. The starting nine can compete with anybody!
- c. Softball: We are very happy that we didn't have to drop our JV team like many other schools did. We lost 5 starters.
- d. Boys Volleyball: Larry reported that they are 8 and 4 and have a very good team this year. League starts tomorrow. Paige Molina is the JV coach.
- e. Girls Cross Country: Coach Fakkema reported that this year the team would be traveling to Lynden, Washington, for the Invitational as they do every 3 years. This has proven over the years to be a very beneficial trip for the student athletes.
- f. Boys Soccer: Cody Catano made 1st league all team. James Booth played in the all-star game. Starting April 4th and every Monday after there will be open Soccer practice from 5:30 – 7:30.
- g. Track and Field: Larry reported on the new fully automated timing system. It is very cool and gives good credibility on our times. It worked well at the Invitational with 21 schools.
- h. Football: Coach Hurst reported that about 30 kids were coming out almost every day and that they all have great attitudes. Andy Kiminski will be joining the coaching staff as an offensive line coach. The football summer camp's goal is to raise enough money to take the players to a "ropes" camp in Big Bear to work on team building.

REQUEST:

The Ontario Christian Athletic Department would like to submit a request to the boosters club to provide funds for a Ground Battle Chute and a Classic Two Man Sled.

RATIONALE:

Ground Battle Chute

In general, the Ground Battle Chutes are designed to keep players low and maintain a good football position while moving. The goal is to train as many athletes as possible, in as many varied drills as possible, and in the shortest possible time - The angled legs of the chutes allow more room. Each leg doesn't go straight down. This, in effect, increases your workable space under the chutes. Players can exit the chutes from every angle, including through the legs.

"Successful line play, offensively and defensively, involves low pads, leverage and proper technique. When a lineman is performing at a low pad level for an extended distance, any technique deficiencies he possesses will be detected. Most chutes are short and narrow and limit movement. This is why the Ground Battle Chute is the most versatile chute on the market. This chute is wide, long, adjustable, and safe and has no inner supports that inhibit lateral or diagonal movement. Whatever your blocking scheme, trap, zone, counter, combo or fold, this chute will accommodate your team."

Classic Two Man Sled

Is the king of teaching the body mechanics of blow delivery. All of the fundamentals are encompassed in this one sled. The reason so many NFL teams use this sled is its effectiveness. It is a unique design.

The Crowther gives the player and coach immediate, objective feedback. It allows a player (1 or 2 players) to drive the sled straight when blocked skillfully. The pan base will spin away if hit poorly. Choose your match-ups and place 2 players on the sled and compete. Each player will give 100% effort or he'll get beat by his teammate. Without good footwork an offensive lineman won't have consistent success. One of the best ways to teach footwork is with the Classic Two Man PAN Sled.

"There's no better way to teach the fundamentals: low center of gravity, explosion of the hips, striking with the forearm, moving the feet, keeping the head up, butt lower than shoulders, back straight, knees bent, taking short driving steps, than with the Crowther."
